

Council Meeting
April 12, 2010
7:00 P.M.

The Mayor and Council of the City of Maysville met on Monday, April 12, 2010, 7:00 p.m. at the Maysville Library.

PRESENT: Mayor Jerry Baker, Councilmember's Clay Dorsey, Lynn Villyard, Stephan Lewis, City Clerk Barbara Thomas, City Attorney Jody Cooley. Councilmember Rebecca McNeely was not present.

Mayor Baker opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the flag and invocation.

APPROVE MINUTES:

The minutes of March 1, 2010, Regular Meeting, March 11, 2010, Public Hearing, March 11, 2010, Special Called Meeting, March 18, 2010, Special Called Meeting was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Council approved the installation of a Fire Hydrant at the end of Deer Run, cost not to exceed \$3,777.00. The motion was made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.

The Ordinance for the Historic Preservation was tabled until the May meeting.

Mayor Baker stated that the building wall had fallen at the corner of Gillsville Highway and Brevard Street. The owner, Brad Morris was contacted, and informed the Mayor that he would get it cleaned up, along with the other buildings in that area.

NEW BUSINESS:

The proposal from Engineering Management Inc. for a Water and Sewer Capital Improvement Program was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried. Cost not to exceed \$3,777.00.

The Jackson County Housing/Booking Contract was tabled until discussion was held at the upcoming Jackson County Service Delivery Meeting.

The Council approved the GMA debt collection service contract. The motion was made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Lynn Villyard. Motion carried.

A proposal from Georgia Power to provide lighting for the Streetscape project was approved. Cost Option # 1 (Government Tariff Rate) \$35,885.00 will come out of the grant and must be paid up front, with a monthly lease of \$77.40. This was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.

Applications are being taken for people who would like to serve on the Historic Preservation Committee. The application will be placed on the city's website and at city hall.

Repairs are needed at the Banks County connection on Mangum Bridge Road. A quote was received from Aqua Flow Service for \$2,658.01. This was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried.

JACKSON COUNTY 911

Steve Nichols from Jackson County 911 was present to talk to the Mayor and Council about the new radio system that is coming to Jackson County. He informed the Council that he would come back at a later date to discuss the possibility of using the new water tank as a tower for the radio system.

LIBRARY REPORT:

Delana Lovell gave a report for the month of March 2010. Copy attached.

Sherri Stephens spoke to the Council about the new cookbook that will be coming out in a couple of weeks. She asked for permission from the City Attorney to publish the names of the Mayor and Council as Friends of the Library. This was approved by Mr. Cooley.

WATER AND SEWER REPORT:

Ralph Sailors, Water and Sewer Department gave a report for the month of March. Copy attached.
