

Regular Council Meeting
Monday, July 12, 2010
7:00 P.M.

The Mayor and Council of the City of Maysville met on Monday, July 12, 2010, 7:00 p.m. at the Maysville Library.

PRESENT: Mayor Jerry Baker, Councilmember's Clay Dorsey, Lynn Villyard, Stephan Lewis, City Clerk Barbara Thomas, Attorney Jody Colley.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE:

Mayor Baker called the meeting together with the invocation and pledge of allegiance. Invocation was given by Mayor Baker.

OLD BUSINESS:

Attorney Jody Colley informed the Council that the historic district ordinance would in essence be a zoning ordinance. It would impose restrictions on properties designated as historic, including putting together a list of the historic structures that can be labeled as historic and restricted. Colley stated that the affected property owners would have to be notified and educated on the move. The Georgia Mountain Regional Commission has a process in place to lay the groundwork for establishing the historic district ordinance. A workshop will be planned for July 29, 2010, 6:00 p.m. with Chip Wright of the Georgia Mountains Regional Commission, as well as the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The first reading was held on the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The second reading and Resolution adoption will be held at the August Council Meeting.

A two year Housing and Booking Contract between The Jackson County Sheriff Department and the City of Maysville was approved as presented. The motion was made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried. Copy attached.

The Council voted to approve a request from Steve Nichols of Jackson County 911 to place a radio antenna on top of the water tower as part of an updated radio system for Jackson County's Emergency Services System. The antenna will be less than five feet tall, and will also include two four foot tall microwave dishes. The motion to approve was made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Lynn Villyard. Motion carried.

Mayor Baker reported that the Streetscape Project was schedule to start on Monday, July 26th. An agreement between the owner-City of Maysville and the Contractor-JHC Corporation was approved by the council. The motion was made by Councilmember Lynn Villyard, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Council authorized Mayor Baker to sign off on the Jackson County Service Delivery Strategy for the city. The motion was made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Lynn Villyard. Motion carried.

The Council authorized Mayor Baker to sign off on the Jackson County SPLOST Intergovernmental Agreement for the city. The motion was made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.

Ms. Melody Stancil made a recommendation to Council to appoint Ms. Lucille Sims to the Downtown Development Authority to replace Marilyn Sherry, who recently resigned. A motion was made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis to accept the recommendation. Motion carried.

A new contract agreement from Sentinel Probation was approved as presented, which provides Probation Service to the Maysville Municipal Court. The supervision probation fee would increase from \$30.00 to \$35.00 per month. A motion to approve the agreement was made by Councilmember Lynn Villyard, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn was made by Councilmember Stephan Lewis, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.
