

The Mayor and Council of the City of Maysville held the regular meeting on Monday, May 4, 2009, 7:00 p.m...

Those present were: Mayor Jerry Baker, Councilmember's Clay Dorsey, Rebecca McNeely, Stephan Lewis, City Clerk Barbara Thomas, and City Attorney Gary Freeman. Councilmember Lynn Villyard was not present.

Mayor Baker opened the meeting with the invocation and pledge of allegiance.

The invocation was given by Councilmember Clay Dorsey.

The minutes of April 2, 2009, April 6, 2009, and April 9, 2009 were approved as presented upon a motion made by Councilmember Rebecca McNeely, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried.

The rezoning of 38 North Main Street was tabled due to changing the zoning from R-2 to MFR. Advertisement will run 15 days to prior to the public hearing.

The council appointed Dylan Wilbanks as the new solicitor for the Maysville Municipal Court. Approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Rebecca McNeely. Motion carried.

The Sewer Use Ordinance (only) was approved as presented upon a motion made by Councilmember Rebecca McNeely, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried. Grease Trap Ordinance will be approved at the June meeting.

The contract for the Wastewater Treatment Facility was approved as presented upon a motion made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis. Motion carried.

The Council approved City Attorney Gary Freeman to send a certified letter to the lawyer for the Maysville Family Practice providing notice that the city is looking for a response about the lease and contract with the city before the next council meeting.

Mayor Baker gave an update on the Streetscape project. Copy attached.

The Council discussed installing outside bathrooms in the red building on Oak Alley. The Community Club has agreed to pay \$2,000.00 toward the project. A motion was made by Councilmember Clay Dorsey, seconded by Stephan Lewis to contribute, but not exceed \$7,000.00 city money. Motion carried. Jackson County will be contacted to see if county inmates can be used for the project. Attorney Freeman stated that this can be paid out of Jackson County SPLOST (Recreation Funds) because it will serve the whole city.

New Business:

The Council amended the Water and Sewer Budget to include a \$20,835.00 for a dump truck. This was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Rebecca McNeely, seconded by Clay Dorsey. Motion carried.

The council approved a temporary real estate (for sale) sign at 6 North Main Street. Motion made by Stephan Lewis, seconded by Rebecca McNeely. Motion carried.

Closed Session-Roll call by Stephan Lewis, Rebecca McNeely, Clay Dorsey, and Mayor Jerry Baker to discuss the possibility of Litigation.
